

2nd International Robin Sequence Consensus Meeting

May 7-8, 2017



Dear Colleague,

The Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the Hospital for Sick Children, University of Toronto is partnering with the Seattle Children's Craniofacial Center to host the Second International Robin Sequence Meeting on May 7 to 8, 2017 at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto. Robin Sequence (a combination of micrognathia, glossoptosis and airway obstruction with clefting of the palate) is a rare congenital condition and affects 1 in 8,000 newborns and presents with profound challenges to life at an early age. This conference will be a 2 full day format held at the Peter Gilgan Center for Research and Learning, 686 Bay Street (corner of Elm and Bay Streets), adjacent to the hospital.

The first meeting was held in Utrecht, the Netherlands in November 2014 and was a sold out event with over 200 attendees from surgical and medical disciplines. Despite the fact that attendance was limited by venue size, this was a remarkable successful event and has attracted considerable interest in a second symposium. The focus of this event is to focus on the optimization of care for these complex patients and to develop international collaborations for data collection and research.
